## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK . . .



After calling his first disciples, who were fishermen on the Sea of Galilee, Jesus had them go with him to Capernaum. Capernaum was located on the north shore of the Sea of Galilee and was the home of Simon Peter. Today you can visit the ruins of the town. It was the Sabbath and Jesus entered the synagogue.

Synagogues were probably formed during the time when the Jews were living in exile and lived far from the Temple in Jerusalem. The synagogue was a place of teaching, a place where the tradition was clarified and passed on, a place of reading, listening, and reflecting. The Gospel tells us that Jesus taught that day in the synagogue at Capernaum. We do not know *what* he said, but we know the reaction of the people. They were amazed, because He taught as one with *authority*.

During his life the most frequent title given to Jesus was "Rabbi," which simply means "*teacher*." He was never called "Reverend" or "Doctor" or "Father." During his lifetime he was seldom called "Messiah" or "Christ" or "Savior." Sometimes, by his followers, he was called "Lord" or "Master." But most of the time, by nearly every one, he was called "Rabbi," (Teacher).

Have you ever had a really good teacher? I shall never forget my fifth grade teacher, Mrs. Steifel. She had a love for her students beyond description, and made each child feel as if they were her favorite. She was a delight in the playground, a joy in the classroom, and creative beyond measure. She had the ability to make difficult subjects come to life with ease of understanding. She was a good teacher because she enlightened her students, not just with facts, but with life lessons.

Many of our best teachers have been outside the educational institutions. They are those who have helped us look more deeply into life, lest we live too superficially. They are those who have demonstrated for us, sometimes without knowing it, how to embrace the beauty of each day, how to know ourselves better, and to recognize what is truly important in life.

Jesus was primarily a teacher in the second sense. He taught things of practical significance, to be sure, such as how to pray. But he was primarily a Rabbi of the things of God. Jesus teaching was not so much instructional as it was healing. A review of the text tells us that Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching because of his unique authority. Then, a demon-possessed man burst into the room. Surprisingly, he was the one who recognized Jesus as the Messiah. "What have you to do with us?" He cried out. "Have you come to destroy us?" Jesus healed him.

Then what did the people say? They said, "What is this? A *new teaching* with authority. He commands even the unclean spirits and they obey him." Again, Mark does not tell us what Jesus taught. He told us how Jesus taught. He taught with an authority that provoked healing.

It is interesting, Jesus is called teacher in Mark most often in connection with miracles. At the stilling of the storm (4:38), he is the teacher. At the raising of the dead (5:35), he is the teacher. At the feeding of the multitude (6:34), he is the teacher. At the healing of a man with epilepsy (9:17), he is the teacher. This means two things. First, it means that Jesus' *teaching* heals people. Second, it means that Jesus' *healings* teach people.

**Jesus' teachings heal.** He teaches us that God is love, and this is healing if we are living in fear of God. He teaches us that God forgives sin; this is healing if we are living with past guilt. He teaches us the importance of living for others, and this is healing if we have become too absorbed with ourselves. *Jesus' teachings heal.*

**Jesus' healings teach.** Jesus never performed a miracle simply for its own sake. In the desert, before he called his first disciples, Jesus rejected the temptations of the evil one in amazing ways. The miracles of Jesus were signs of the kingdom of God. Just as He healed the blind man, He can heal some of your blindness. As he calmed the storm at sea, He can calm the chaos that might exist in your life. As He healed the man with the evil spirit, He can cast out the demons of fear, pride, envy (sin). *Jesus' healings teach.*

In the Christian community every person can be a teacher. Each one of us can discover our individual teaching abilities---as a spiritual mentor, a storyteller for children, a parent, a coach, a music leader, a mentor---knowing that, whatever our specific assignment, we are actually called to teach with our lives. Remember, the best sermon is a good example. And perhaps...someday...someone might just say that you were the best teacher they ever had...and you may never know it.

## How Does Your Family Celebrate the Feast of The Presentation of the Lord! February 2, 2012

This week, we, the Church, celebrate the Presentation of the Lord, the day that Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple about 40 days after he was born. This day is also called "Candlemas" because in our Church's tradition, candles are blessed on this day to remind us of our own Baptism and that we are also called to be light to the world. Jesus was greeted in the temple by the prophet Simeon and a woman named Anna. They knew that Jesus was the Messiah, the Light of the world.

Luke tells us that Simeon was a good man. He loved God and was waiting for God to save the people of Israel. God's Spirit came to him and told him that he would not die until he had seen Christ the Lord.

When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple, the Spirit told Simeon to go into the temple. Simeon took the baby Jesus in his arms and praised God, "Lord, I am your servant, and now I can die in peace, because you have kept your promise to me. With my own eyes I have seen what you have done to save your people, and foreign nations will also see this. Your mighty power is a light for all nations, and it will bring honor to your people Israel."

On the day of Baptism, we were given a lighted candle with these words: "Walk always as children of the light, and keep the flame of faith alive in your hearts."

Why not begin a ritual to renew that faith by lighting your child's Baptismal candle or a new candle as a reminder of the day that he/she became a child of the light. *The candles can be blessed with a prayer:*

God our Creator and Redeemer, bless these candles as signs of your presence and signs of our faith. In the beauty of your holy light, keep us in quiet and in peace. Keep us safe. Turn our hearts to you that we may be light for our world.

*Together, reflect on what it means to be a light to the world.*

*How is Jesus a light to the world?*

*How can you be a light for others?*
